



EAST MAIN CORRIDOR ACTIVITY CENTERS / TRIP GENERATORS



Environmental Review

National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA)

- COTA will evaluate potential social, economic, and environmental impacts
- Federal and state regulatory agencies will be consulted
- Mitigation will be identified for any negative impacts

National Historic Preservation Act - Section 106

- Requires federal agencies to consider effects on historic properties
- Advisory Council on Historic Preservation (ACHP), interested parties, and the public weigh in on any effects
- Coordination currently in progress

What to expect during construction


- Construction will be focused in area directly adjacent to stations
- Limited to no construction off East Main Street
- Minimal widening of the roadway near stations west of Davidson Drive
- Sidewalk and driveway reconstruction
- Intersection improvements
- Access to businesses will be maintained




